## PRAISE

Christ is our peace, who has made us one. Let us worship and praise him. Lord, open our lips That we may glorify and praise your Name Glory to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen. Praise the Lord. Alleluia

## **Come Bless the Lord**

1 Come bless the Lord all you servants of the Lord: you who by night stand in the house of our God.

2 Lift up your hands toward the holy place and bless the Lord: may the Lord bless you from Zion the Lord who made heaven and earth.

Glory to the Father and to the Son: and to the Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning: is now and will be for ever Amen.

## PENITENCE

### A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT BOOK OF MATTHEW 24:45-51

45 'Who then is the faithful and wise slave, whom his master has put in charge of his household, to give the other slaves<sup>±</sup> their allowance of food at the proper time? <sup>46</sup>Blessed is that slave whom his master will find at work when he arrives. <sup>47</sup>Truly I tell you, he will put that one in charge of all his possessions. <sup>48</sup>But if that wicked slave says to himself, "My master is delayed", <sup>49</sup>and he begins to beat his fellow-slaves, and eats and drinks with drunkards, <sup>50</sup>the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour that he does not know. <sup>51</sup>He will cut him in pieces<sup>±</sup> and put him with the hypocrites, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

Preserve us, Lord, while waking And guard us while sleeping That awake we may watch with Christ And asleep we may rest in peace. **Amen.** 

May the Lord bless us and watch over us. May the Lord make is face to shine on us And be gracious to us. May the Lord look kindly on us And give us peace.
